BIODIVERSITY ENHANCEMENT OVERVIEW


The project comprises demolition of part of the existing School, a larger extension to be built in its place and various internal works to upgrade the School. The value of the project is £3.1 million.

After noticing the lack of small bird activity in the area (East London) we have installed various bird boxes and roosting pouches. These have been put up to attract the likes of small House and Tree Sparrows, Blue and Great Tits, Nuthatches and Robins. These have been placed at the correct heights to ensure no disturbance by predators. We have installed:

- 2 bird boxes
- 2 roosting pouches
- 1 bird feeder

We have placed these within our site, on the site boundary and also within the school playground. These will all be donated to the school on completion of the project – they will then be used as part of the curriculum for the school children to learn about nature in their urban surroundings.
