The winners of the 2016 BIG Biodiversity Challenge are...

On Thursday 15 September, the <u>BIG Biodiversity Challenge</u> 2016 competition reached its finale with eight well deserved winning entries announced along with an overall winner of this year's Challenge. With an impressive 155 entries received this year across eight award categories, organisations have shown how their projects are helping to strengthen biodiversity across the UK.

Led by CIRIA's Biodiversity Interest Group (BIG), the BIG Biodiversity Challenge, asks the industry to 'do one thing' for biodiversity and industry has responded with a huge breadth of entries submitted for this year's Challenge. Speaking at the Awards, Professor Steve Ormerod, Chairman of Council, RSPB & Professor of Ecology, Cardiff University, concluded that "Nature in the UK is in trouble, but the small and large changes we make together do make a difference for our wildlife – whether its integrating swift bricks into buildings, softening the design of new developments with nature in mind, or major landscape scale restoration at mineral extraction sites. I'm delighted to see how much the BIG Biodiversity Challenge is gaining momentum – evident from the number of entries received this year. My thanks go out to all the businesses for their commitment to improving biodiversity across all stages of the construction cycle".

We are proud to announce this year's BIG Biodiversity Challenge Awards overall winner is **Breakthrough Community**Enterprise/Nationwide Forestry Solutions for their project

"Symbiosis" - encompassing an acre of land with 11 industrial units on a much larger industrial estate, based on reclaimed coal spoil. The project comprises a nursery with 30000 native trees saplings (from local seed), open woodland, closed woodland, close scrub, meadow, and mature mixed hedge line habitats along with multi height mowing regime in the open areas.



Commenting on their win **Jon Murcott, Managing Director, Nationwide Forestry Solutions Ltd** said "To be part of such a prestigious event, in the company of so many high profile organisations was an honour in itself. To win the Maintenance & Management Award left us all speechless, and then to top that by winning the Overall Award really does mean everything".

Congratulations to all the category winners, commendations to those that were shortlisted, and a big thank you to all the entries received this year as well as our sponsors for their support.
