Hampstead Heath Ponds Project Atkins, City of London and BAM Nuttall

The Flood and Water Quality Management works at Hampstead Heath is a high-profile and complex project – its purpose to virtually eliminate the risk of dam failure within the two main chains of ponds on Hampstead Heath during extreme rainfall events. There was also a need to protect the natural environment of the Heath and opportunity to implement important biodiversity enhancement and water quality improvements. Help the hedgehogs Glenwood Park Development - Glenwood farm near Devon Redrow Homes Ltd

Small, square marked holes are being built into the new garden fences in Redrow's Glenwood Park development, at Glenwood Farm near Devon. The Hedgehog Highway concept was developed by People's Trust for Endangered Species and the British Hedgehog Preservation Society as a simple way of making gardens hedgehog -friendly. The small hole will allow hedgehogs to move between gardens while they forage for food without the restrictions of fences and walls. Find out more about this project.

Highways England Area 1 Blackhall Farm Management Kier Highways & StOC

Blackhall Farm is 1.5 hectares in size of which approximately 50% is grassland and 50% is woodland. In 2014/15 Kier undertook a Habitat Connectivity Study which highlighted the importance of Blackhall Farm on a landscape scale. Kier decided to take an innovative approach to managing & maintaining Blackhall Farm that goes above normal business practice to maximise habitat connectivity, biodiversity and community relations.
