CIRIA is pleased to announce that the **BIG Biodiversity Challenge 2018** was officially launched at an event hosted at City Hall on 28 February, in London. Led by the BIG Biodiversity Interest Group, since 2013 the Challenge has invited the construction industry to add biodiversity enhancements to construction sites, developments or existing buildings, regardless of size, and whether permanent or temporary.

The packed launch event, brought together clients, consultants, contractors, house builders, ecologists, landscape architects as well past awards winners who outlined their 2017 award winning projects, highlighting how any biodiversity enhancement, big or small, does make a BIG difference.

Getting involved in the Challenge and Awards is easy. Simply sign up to take the Challenge, enter the Awards, sponsor an award category or join us on social media @bigbiodiversity #BIGAwards. This year we have introduced an Innovation award that encourages submission of enhancement projects that demonstrate innovative habitat creation, application of bespoke interventions, data collection and collation as well as projects that demonstrate unusual and alternative approaches to the normal. Interventions projects that provide a lasting legacy and support continual learning and improvement will be viewed most favourably.

The BIG Awards are a great opportunity to celebrate the best biodiversity initiatives across the UK, and share the lessons learned. We are proud to support such a great endeavour".

CIRIA's BIG Biodiversity Challenge offers advice and learning to show how biodiversity enhancements can be simple, affordable and achievable. The Challenge has gained huge momentum with over 155 entries received last year, from sites all over the country. Enhancements included installing bug hotels and bat boxes, restoring riverbanks and wildflower meadows and delivering detailed biodiversity action plans. Doing just one thing really can make a BIG difference in helping to reverse the decline of Biodiversity in the UK.

- BIG Biodiversity Champion award
- Client award sponsored by Kier
- Community engagement award sponsored by Landsec
- Project of vear award small scale (below 5ha)
- Project of year award –medium-large scale (5ha or over) sponsored by British Land
- Innovation award new award for 2018
- Monitoring, maintenance and management award sponsored by Sir Robert McAlpine
- Pollinator project of the year award
- Temporary project of year award
