BIG Biodiversity Challenge Award Category: Community Engagement

Project overview

 Supporting local communities and charities through Volunteering and funding for enhancement projects is part and parcel of a sustainably conscious organisation, as an organisation we wanted to support a local charity so we seized on a opportunity to work with a local primary school to help enhance the biodiversity of their expanding and regularly used wildlife area on the school grounds.

What were the biodiversity conditions on site, prior to the enhancement?

 The wildlife area on the school grounds was in need of work to clear low lying scrub and brambles, pond area was over grown with little access for students to safely use, overgrown grass meadow and footbridge access point made it difficult for staff and students to enter the area via the approved route.

What were the reasons behind this project?

- We saw this as a great opportunity to not only work/volunteer in the community but also to provide biodiversity net gain to an area that is constantly being used by the school and their students to enable them to learn more about wildlife and biodiversity.
- This enhancement project also fell under our Sustainable Delivery Plan and strategy 2015-2020 as a one of the keys areas we wanted to target over the 5 year period.

What were the biodiversity measures taken?

All Scrub and brambles cleared were cut and composted in the wildlife area, turf removed from the meadow area was reused to create a grass bank to prevent growth of low lying shrub to invade the planting area, the deck area of the pond was cleared to allow better access for students and further work required to extend the decking further into the pond. The Access bridge was cleared to make way for any repairs required to allow safe access in the wildlife area. To assist the school and students Lundy Projects Ltd donated £5k so that the school could purchase tools and equipment to maintain the area, future work in partnership with the Parent committee and school leadership team to maintain and further enhance the area in 2018.
